- The term Gentil is reserved for wines of the Alsace AOC that meet the standards of a blend of high quality. This blend consists of at least 50% Riesling, Muscat, Pinot Gris and / or Gewurztraminer, the rest being composed of Sylvaner, Chasselas and / or Pinot Blanc. Before blending, each variety must be vinified separately and must have obtained approval from the Alsace AOC. Le Gentil must mention the vintage.

The Walla Walla Valley AVA is an American Viticultural Area located within Washington and extending partly into the northeastern corner of Oregon. The wine region is entirely included within the larger Columbia Valley AVA. The area is named after the Walla Walla people who lived along the shores of the Walla Walla River at its junction with the Snake River and the Columbia River. The name Walla Walla means "rapid stream" or "many waters". In addition to grapes, this area is an agricultural producer of sweet onions, wheat and strawberries.
